TREASURE CHESTS & TALL TALES

Little pirates, mighty imaginations!

Ahoy, mateys! This Petals & Play Thursday, we're setting sail for Talk Like a Pirate Day! With treasure maps, tall tales, and playful pretend, children will dive into imagination and discovery. Each activity sparks creativity, teamwork, and exploration while supporting WMELS domains. From crafting treasure chests to marching in a pirate parade, little learners will practice problem-solving, language, and cooperation as they chart their own course through play.

TREASURE MAP MAKERS

Materials:

- Paper
- Crayons/markers

• Stickers V

• "X" cutouts

Instructions:

Children draw their own treasure maps, adding paths, landmarks, and of course an "X"! Hide small items around the room and let children follow their maps to find them.

Targets WMELS Domains:

- Cognition & General Knowledge (mapping, sequencing)
- Language Development (storytelling, symbols)
- Physical Development (movement, spatial awareness)

TREASURE THEST TOLLAGE

Materials:

- Small boxes/paper cutouts
- Tissue paper
- Stickers

- Glue
- Craft gems

Instructions:

Children decorate treasure chests and fill them with "treasures" — drawings of things they love, positive words, or small found objects.

Targets WMELS Domains:

- Creative Arts (collage, crafting)
- Social Emotional (expressing values, sharing ideas)
- Language Development (labeling treasures, vocabulary)



PIRATE HAT PARADE

Materials:

- Construction paper
- Tape/staplers



• "X" cutouts



Instructions:

Children make pirate hats and decorate them with their own pirate symbols. Then, march around the room together chanting "Ahoy!" and "Arrr!" like true pirates.

Targets WMELS Domains:

- Creative Arts (designing hats, self-expression)
- Physical Development (movement, marching)
- Social Emotional (group participation, confidence)



Materials:

• None (optional: treasure chest with "story starters" inside)

Instructions:

Begin a pirate adventure story as a group, then pass it along with each child adding their own piece. The story grows taller and sillier as it goes around the circle.

Targets WMELS Domains:

- Language Development (vocabulary, sequencing, storytelling)
- Social Emotional (turn-taking, listening)
- Cognition (creativity, problem-solving)



WALK THE PLANK

Materials:

- Tape/balance beam
- Beanbags/gold coinsCraft gems

Instructions:

Tape a "plank" on the floor and challenge children to balance as they walk across. Add treasure (beanbags or coins) for them to carry safely to the other side.

Targets WMELS Domains:

- Physical Development (balance, coordination)
- Cognition (planning, problem-solving)
- Social Emotional (confidence, persistence)
